William M. (Billy) Cope

Billy Cope was born in Savannah, Georgia on August 19, 1947, to Ralph M. (WWII) & Mary E. Cope. He was educated in the local public school system, graduating from Groves High School in 1965. While in school he was a member of the junior ROTC program attaining the rank of major in his senior year. He also was a reporter for the school paper with several accolades for writing by his teachers.

After completion of Air Force Basic Military Training, Billy was assigned to the 1171n Tactical Air Control Squadron as security forces and later transferred to the 1551n Communications Flight as a telephone maintenance technician. Sergeant Cope was instrumental in the implementation of the Closed-Circuit Television Cable Plant at the 1551n Air Wing. He served as lead technician in the construction of the Local Area Network and was an essential part of mission accomplishments of the unit.

Sergeant Cope was sent on temporary assignment to the Combat Readiness Training Center in Mississippi to assist with upgrades to the base telephone and public address system. He performed extensive quality control measures by installing, mapping, and maintaining the Wing's telecommunications equipment infrastructure directly impacting the unit's combat readiness capabilities.

While serving as the computer network, switching and cryptographic systems communications manager the base communications system was struck by lightning resulting in a complete shutdown of the system. Senior Master Sergeant Cope's professional skill, knowledge and leadership aided in the complete restoration of the base communications systems which are essential in the daily mission requirements. Through his devotion to duty, the internet network, server and telephone system were fully restored in less than two weeks.

Billy is a past Commander of the Catholic War Veterans Post 1943. His leadership as commander resulted in over three hundred memorial crosses installed at the Catholic Cemetery. The crosses represent Veterans who served across all services and the many different conflicts over the years. He sponsored a Christmas program where members of post 1943 collect Christmas gifts for the soldiers' children at Hunter Army Airfield and distributed during the holiday season. He currently serves as the Chaplain for the Chatham County Veterans Council.

Billy's volunteerism and service before self is indicative of the number of civic and military organizations in which he serves. Billy Cope is an exemplary veteran, and his record speaks for itself. He is most deserving of recognition as the Chatham County Veterans Council Veteran of the Year 2025/2026.

The purpose of this letter is to offer my highest recommendation that Mr. Samuel L. Currie; Chief Master Sergeant, USAF, (ret) be favorably considered as Veteran of the Year. As a retired Army Aviation Officer with 26 years' active service, having the honor of commanding soldiers in combat at both the Company and Battalion level, I recognize selfless service, sacrifice and humble leadership that inspires others. Sam embodies all those qualities and would make a wonderful representative as Veteran of the Year.

Sam is a native of this area; born in Brunswick, moved to Savannah at two years old, and attended Savannah Public School. As a young man he joined the USAF to become an Aircraft Loadmaster and was assigned to Travis AFB, 22nd Military Airlift Squadron flying the C-5A aircraft.
